

Who can be a delegate?

Article XI of NAHU's bylaws states:

“The House of Delegates shall consist of:

A. The Board of Trustees

B. Past Presidents of NAHU

C. Delegates of state and local associations as designated in Sections 2 and 3 of this ARTICLE.”

To be able to represent a chapter as a delegate, the person must be an active member in good standing of the chapter he or she is representing. For example, to be a delegate for Greater Washington AHU the person must be an active member of Greater Washington AHU in good standing which means all dues are paid through June 30, of the current year, for Greater Washington AHU, Maryland AHU and National AHU.

Additionally, a **past state president** in good standing may be appointed as a delegate for any local chapter in the state of which he or she presided regardless of his or her local membership.

Past NAHU presidents and **current Board of Trustee members** are not eligible to be state or local chapter delegates; they are already voting members of the House of Delegate as representatives for their groups as listed in NAHU's bylaws (see above).
